Text: Acts 3:1-10

Theme: ACTS-ION:

**The Dynamic Life of Christ's Church –
Then and Now**

SUMMARY OF “SERMON”: Jesus carries on His ministry of healing and transformation by the power of the Holy Spirit through His disciples in this episode of the lame man being healed and giving praise to God. The cripple's perspective is radically transformed. The Kairos timing is also reflected. That is, Peter and John had probably passed this man many times but at this particular moment the Holy Spirit led them to stop and pray for him.

RELATED BIBLE PASSAGES FOR THE COMING WEEK [The Bible readings this week help illuminate aspects of the healing of the crippled man in Acts 3:1-10.]

Monday, Feb. 13 – **Romans 5:1-11** [These verses describe how our salvation through faith in Christ is all by God's grace and an evidence of His amazing love. Note, v.6, that Christ died at just the right “time”. Time here is “Kairos”, referring to just the right season in God's plan of salvation.]

Tuesday, Feb. 14 – **Isaiah 35** [The prophet paints for us a beautiful picture of the transformation that the coming of Messiah will bring. Among other evidences of Messiah's presence, v.6, is that “the lame leap like a deer.” Surely, the healed cripple in Acts 3 fits that picture.]

Wednesday, Feb. 15 – **I Corinthians 2:6-16** [Paul makes clear that conversion to Christ along with the indwelling Holy Spirit give the Christian a very different perspective on life and the world than those without faith in our Lord.]

Thursday, Feb. 16 – **I Samuel 17** [In the well-known story of David's slaying of the Philistine giant, Goliath, we find Israel's King Saul and its army crippled in fear with a perspective of helplessness. But David, sensing a Kairos moment, has the perspective of faith in God and His supreme power.]

Friday, Feb. 17 – **Luke 5:17-26** [In Jesus' ministry, here is another healing of a lame man, both physically and spiritually. Jesus' focus was teaching. But He sensed a Kairos moment (“...the power of the Lord was present...”) and ministered healing to the whole person.]

Saturday, Feb. 18 – **Psalms 107** [This psalm recounts different times and periods in Israel's history when, due to their sin or circumstances, they were in desperate straits. Then, their perspective would change from self to the Lord and they would cry out to Him. In a Kairos moment, He would deliver them from their particular crisis.]
