Text: Acts 18:1-4

**Theme: ACTS-ION:
The Dynamic Life of Christ's Church –
Then and Now**

SUMMARY OF “SERMON”: What initially seemed like a bad circumstance for Aquila and Priscilla – being kicked out of Rome and having to settle in Corinth – turned out to be a great detour. God matched them up with the apostle Paul and they became key leaders in the early church. God is sovereign and our call, as Christ's followers, is to faithfully serve the Lord when everything is going as it should but also when we face trials and uncertainties.

RELATED BIBLE PASSAGES FOR THE COMING WEEK [The Bible readings this week remind us of God's sovereignty and great wisdom in accomplishing His purposes in the world and in our lives.]

*Monday, Mar. 27 – **Romans 8:28-39*** [Perhaps no other passage in the Bible compares with this in affirming that no matter what happens God is in charge and is working out the best for His beloved children. We are anchored securely in the love of Christ.]

*Tuesday, Mar. 28 – **Psalms 33*** [This is a great psalm of praise and worship of God. Not just because of who He is but because of confidence in His sovereign rule over all the affairs of the nations. Note especially the ultimate truth of vv.10-11.]

*Wednesday, Mar. 29 – **I Timothy 6:11-16*** [Timothy is encouraged to flee worldly pursuits and to seek godliness knowing that God is in charge and at the right time Christ will return (vv.14-15)]

*Thursday, Mar. 30 – **Isaiah 45:1-13*** [This prophecy is remarkable in two ways. First, long before it happened Isaiah knows the name of the ruler of Persia who will return the Jews to their homeland. Second, this ruler, Cyrus, is called God's 'anointed' (v.1) even though Cyrus is a pagan king. The point is that God will still use Cyrus for divine purposes. The passage reveals God's power and might over all of creation.]

*Friday, Mar. 31 – **Romans 11:25-36*** [Even Paul finds God's plan of working out salvation to Jews and Gentiles in Christ a plan beyond our total grasp, leading to the blessed doxology to close out the chapter.]

*Saturday, Apr. 1 – **Habakkuk 1:12-2:20*** [The prophet Habakkuk did not question Judah's rebellion against God and the need for discipline. What he couldn't understand is how God could use the wicked, pagan Babylonians to carry out divine judgement against Judah. God's ways are not our ways and our call, 2:4, is to live by faith.]
