Text: *John 12:1-11*

SUMMARY OF SERMON: The night before Palm Sunday a dinner party is thrown to honor Jesus. Honoring the Lord is expressed in various ways: hospitality, fellowship, service, faith, and loving sacrifice. Dishonoring the Lord was evident also in the actions of Judas. Honoring the Lord is a choice that comes from the heart and puts the focus on Him.

RELATED BIBLE PASSAGES FOR THE COMING WEEK [The Bible readings this week are about honoring the Lord.]

Monday, Apr. 10 – **John 5:16-30** [In this passage Jesus is being very transparent that He is God the Father's Son doing the Father's will on earth. V.23 makes it clear that anyone who truly desires to honor God must honor Jesus, the Son.]

Tuesday, Apr. 11 – **Exodus 12:31-42** [On the night of the first Passover, God delivered the enslaved Israelites out of Egypt, a foreshadowing of Jesus, our Passover Lamb, delivering us out of bondage to sin. To honor the Lord the Israelites were to observe the Passover (v.42), even as we observe rituals such as the Lord's Supper to honor our Savior.]

Wednesday, Apr. 12 – **I Corinthians 6:12-20** [We honor God by living a godly lifestyle, following His ways. Our bodies are members of Christ and filled with the Holy Spirit. Although the context is about sexual purity, the principle is that all that we say and do is to honor our Lord.]

Thursday, Apr. 13 – **Psalms 50** [Honoring God results from a heart that seeks Him and trusts Him (v.15) as well as a heart that is thankful (v.23). God is not honored by those who may perform outward rituals but do not seek Him because they selfishly pursue evil.]

Friday, Apr. 14 – **I Corinthians 1:18-31** [Believers of all ages, including us, honor our Lord Jesus when we recognize the wisdom and power of God demonstrated at the cross and we humbly and thankfully put our faith in Jesus, crucified and risen, and follow Him as Lord of our lives.]

Saturday, Apr. 15 – **Luke 23:50-56** [Joseph of Arimathea and the women who prepared spices honored Jesus at His crucifixion by making sure, even in their grief, that Jesus received an appropriate burial. Their plans set the stage for the dramatic miracle that would occur that first Easter morning!]



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
