Text: Acts 16:6-10

**ACTS-ION: The Dynamic Life
of Christ's Church - Then and Now**

SUMMARY OF "SERMON": As Paul and his companions travelled on their Second Missionary Journey their original plans were altered by the leading of the Holy Spirit. Interestingly, the scriptures do not tell us how the Holy Spirit was guiding them but He was and they knew it. The Holy Spirit's guidance in the lives of Christians will never contradict the Bible but as we stay surrendered to Christ each day the Holy Spirit will guide us.

RELATED BIBLE PASSAGES FOR THE COMING WEEK [The readings this week illustrate the leading and guiding of the Holy Spirit.]

*Monday, June 5 – **Acts 15:22-35*** [The Holy Spirit was instrumental in guiding the early Church through a difficult decision making process about whether or not Gentile converts to Christ needed to also follow the Jewish law. In announcing the final decision, the Church leaders alluded to the Holy Spirit's guidance (v.28).]

*Tuesday, June 6 – **Galatians 5:16-26*** [When we live by the Spirit, He will not guide us in the worldly ways of sin. Instead, He will fill us with Christ-like virtues and guide us in Christ-like living.]

*Wednesday, June 7 – **Joel 2:28-32*** [This prophecy was quoted by Peter on the Day of Pentecost. Although it does not specifically mention guidance, these different manifestations of the Spirit (e.g. visions and prophecy) are clearly means by which the Holy Spirit guides, as was evident in our text.]

*Thursday, June 8 – **John 16:5-16*** [Jesus spent quite a bit of His "upper room" discourse on discussing the work of the Holy Spirit in His followers. V.13 clarifies that the Holy Spirit will guide us into all truth...truth that is always consistent with God's holy word.]

*Friday, June 9 – **1 Corinthians 2:6-16*** [Paul makes the amazing statement that because of the Holy Spirit in our lives we (i.e. the body of Christ) actually have the mind of Christ (v.16). The Holy Spirit gives us a whole new worldview, consistent with God's Word, and guides us accordingly.]

*Saturday, June 10 – **Ezekiel 36:24-32*** [In this prophecy about the age of the Messiah, Ezekiel envisions the Holy Spirit indwelling God's children. Again, although guidance is not specifically mentioned, the fact that the Holy Spirit moves us to follow God's ways is reflected in a Christ-honoring life style affecting our daily decisions.]



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SUGGESTIONS FOR PRAYER FOR THE “LORD’S WATCH”

Tuesday, June 6, 2017

The “**Lord’s Watch**” is a growing commitment of South King County churches to pray together for revival, reconciliation, reformation, and reaching the lost. Participating churches choose a particular day each month to pray. Following is a loose outline to provide cohesiveness for each of us in praying the Lord’s Watch.

I. Rejoice/Adoration

[Use an appropriate scripture: e.g. Psalm 100, Ephesians 1:15-23]

II. Repentance/Confession

[Psalm 139:23-24, Isaiah 59:1-2]

III. Revival in the Church

[e.g. Psalm 85:6-9]

IV. Reconciliation

[e.g. II Corinthians 5:16-21]

Pray for unity between churches, and between Christians at work, in neighborhoods, schools, families, etc.

V. Reformation in Society

Pray for the infusion of God’s righteousness and justice to address the issues of crime, drugs, immorality, poverty, materialism, loss of sanctity of life, etc.

VI. Reaching the Lost

Pray for an awakening among those without Christ, including all ages, and all ethnic groups. Pray for a desire to seek Him who is “the way, the truth, and the life.” [John 14:6]

VII. Reflect

[Psalm 111:2] Think of the mighty works of God and of His promises to you, our congregation, the churches of South King County, and to our society. Let’s all freshly yield ourselves to seek God’s kingdom and His righteousness.

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
