**Text: *I Corinthians 12:1-7***

**SUMMARY OF SERMON:** As we follow Christ not only does the Holy Spirit bear fruit in our lives so that Christ's character is reproduced in us but He also empowers us with gifts to enhance our witness for Christ. Our confession that Jesus is Lord is confirmed by our delight in serving others with our God-given gift mix and our seeking the common good for the glory of God.

**RELATED BIBLE PASSAGES FOR THE COMING WEEK** [The Bible readings this week reveal the importance of Holy Spirit-empowered service and witness for Christ as our Lord.]

*Monday, Oct. 24* – **Acts 2:1-13** [This passage reveals the answer to Jesus' command to the disciples to wait in Jerusalem until they are empowered by the Holy Spirit. This event is described as Pentecost, occurring 50 days after the resurrection and seen as the birthdate of Christ's Church.]

*Tuesday, Oct. 25* – **Ephesians 3:14-21** [In this beautiful prayer of Paul note the frequent references to "power". It is the Holy Spirit who answers these petitions and empowers in inner transformation as well as empowering us to grasp the incredible dimensions of God's love for us in Christ.]

*Wednesday, Oct. 26* – **Judges 14** [It is clear in the book of Judges, including in this chapter, that Samson's remarkable exploits were accomplished by the Holy Spirit's power coming upon him. Unfortunately, Samson's character revealed a lack of the Holy Spirit's work of transformation that we now have in Christ.]

*Thursday, Oct. 27* – **Matthew 12:22-28** [In this deliverance ministry Jesus makes it clear (v.28) that all that He is empowered to do – deliverance, healings, etc. – is by the power of the Holy Spirit working in and through Him. So it is with us His followers.]

*Friday, Oct. 28* – **I Corinthians 2:1-5** [Paul was not known as a flashy orator. As seen here his effectiveness was based upon preaching Christ crucified and with a demonstration of the Holy Spirit's power.]
