Bible Text: *Variety*

SUMMARY OF SERMON: The concept of being “set apart” is a biblical theme. The Son of God was set apart to come to earth and bring salvation to us sinners. All those who follow Jesus Christ by faith are set apart for the glory of God. Even things used by God’s people are set apart for that function. As we prepare for the season of Lent we will be setting ourselves apart in a fresh way at the Communion Table to serve our Lord and we will also anoint and set apart our facility, inside and outside, for the glory of God.

RELATED BIBLE PASSAGES FOR THE COMING WEEK [The Bible readings this week reflect on the biblical theme of being set apart.]

Monday, Feb. 8 – **Leviticus 20:22-26** [The Israelites (vv.24, 26) were set apart by God from the nations. They were to live according to God’s law and not the ways of the world. This separation was not because they were superior to or less sinful than the nations. Rather, it was to demonstrate right worship of the true God and be a light to the Gentiles.]

Tuesday, Feb. 9 – **Genesis 21:22-34** [In a dispute over rights to a well that Abraham had dug, he made a treaty with Abimelech that involved “setting apart” seven lambs. The purpose for setting apart these animals, as Abraham explained, was to give witness to his truth and integrity in the matter.]

Wednesday, Feb. 10 – **Hebrews 7:11-28** [In pointing out that Jesus is God’s perfect High Priest forever, the author of Hebrews emphasizes (v.26) that among other things Jesus was “set apart from sinners.” I.E. He was sinless and pure, an absolute necessity for His being an atoning sacrifice for us.]

Thursday, Feb. 11 – **Ezra 8:21-34** [Ezra set apart 12 priests to guard the treasury for God’s house. Likewise, the Church sets apart particular leaders to serve with particular functions in God’s house.]

Friday, Feb. 12 – **Jeremiah 1:5-19** [Jeremiah felt very inadequate to serve as God’s prophet to a rebellious Judah at a very difficult time. But God assured Jeremiah of His presence and even points out (v.5) that Jeremiah had been set apart by God for this purpose before he was even born.]

Saturday, Feb. 13 – **Numbers 8:5-26** [Moses was given instructions by God in how to set the Levites apart from the rest of the Israelites. They were not superior. Instead, they were set apart for the priesthood to focus on leading the people in the worship of God.]
