SUMMARY OF SERMON: Joseph was an administrator. Sold by his brothers into slavery in Egypt, Joseph's master saw his giftedness and made Joseph steward over all of his household. Thrown unjustly into prison, the warden made Joseph an administrator over the other inmates. Miraculously delivered from prison, Pharaoh, king of Egypt, sees Joseph's administrative gifting as essential in getting Egypt through a crisis.

RELATED BIBLE PASSAGES FOR THE COMING WEEK [The Bible readings this week highlight some administrators and administrative characteristics.]

Monday, May 23 – **John 6:1-13** [The feeding of the 5,000 is a good example of Jesus using the gift of administrator. The situation required both the ability to see the big picture as well as the steps taken to address a major problem. Jesus also knew how to delegate responsibility.]

Tuesday, May 24 – **Exodus 18** [It does not appear that Moses had the gift of administrator. Thankfully, his father-in-law, Jethro, exhibited this gift. It was Jethro's suggestion that Moses appoint qualified officials to share the load of dealing with the peoples' issues that brought relief to Moses' overworked schedule.]

Wednesday, May 25 – **Mark 3:7-18** [Jesus showed administrative gifting in being able to work with large crowds. At the same time, He prayerfully selected a particular group of disciples and specifically trained them. They were to be "with him" (v.14) and also to be sent out on mission (delegation). Both intimacy and service.]

Thursday, May 26 – **Nehemiah 2:11-20** [Throughout the book of Nehemiah we see this man's administrative ability as he oversees the rebuilding of Jerusalem and its walls after the return from the exile. Notice here that what Nehemiah initially does is get the big picture to enable him to break down what needs to be done.]

Friday, May 27 - **Matthew 10:1-16** [After Jesus has spent some time modeling how He does ministry in word and deed, He then sends His "trainees" (disciples) out on mission. This delegation of the kingdom work is symptomatic of a good administrator.]

Saturday, May 28 – **I Chronicles 28** [David seemed to indicate a gifting as administrator. We notice this in quite a few places including in this chapter towards the end of David's reign as king where he helped make plans for the building of the temple and appointed leaders to carry out the task.]
