**Texts: Romans 12:3-6a**  
**SPRING 2016 SERIES:**  
**The Christian and Spiritual Gifts**

**SUMMARY OF SERMON:** Most of the book of Romans has emphasized the common foundation of all Christians: faith in Jesus Christ, crucified and risen, restoring us to the Father and uniting us in Christ. In this Romans passage that precedes the listing of the seven motivational gifts Paul emphasizes that by God's grace we are different. This is no cause for pride or for false humility. It is a reminder that each of us has a significant function in the body of Christ.

**RELATED BIBLE PASSAGES FOR THE COMING WEEK** [The Bible readings this week how God has made different key people of the Bible. Although these tend to have major roles the point is that God has made us just the way He saw best for His glory.]

*Monday, June 6* – **Genesis 17:1-8** [God made Abraham the father of many nations. This promise would be fulfilled through the nations putting faith in Jesus Christ (see Romans 4:17 and context).]

*Tuesday, June 7* – **Exodus 6:28-7:7**[In and of himself, Moses would have no influence over Pharaoh, king of Egypt. But God would make Moses "like God" before Pharaoh. God working through His people, including us, accomplishes divine purposes.]

*Wednesday, June 8* – **I Kings 3:1-15** [Solomon was acutely aware of his inadequacy to be king over Israel. But he knew that God had made him to be just that (v.7) so he sought God's favor. So can we no matter how inadequate we feel about God's assignments to us.]

*Thursday, June 9* – **Jeremiah 1** [God called Jeremiah to a most difficult position – a prophet announcing God's just judgment upon rebellious Israel. Yet, v.18, God promised Jeremiah that He would make him strong and able to withstand the peoples' rejection.]

*Friday, June 10* - **Ezekiel 3:16-27** [God made Ezekiel a "watchman" for the house of Israel (v.17). This required Ezekiel to take responsibility for what God wanted him to do. Likewise we are to take responsibility for how God has made us.]

*Saturday, June 11* – **Acts 13:42-52** [Paul preached the gospel of Jesus Christ to Jews, but also to the Gentiles. He quoted the OT to show that God made him to fulfill this purpose.]



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# SUGGESTIONS FOR PRAYER FOR THE “LORD’S WATCH”

Tuesday, June 7, 2016

The “**Lord’s Watch**” is a growing commitment of South King County churches to pray together for revival, reconciliation, reformation, and reaching the lost. Participating churches choose a particular day each month to pray. Following is a loose outline to provide cohesiveness for each of us in praying the Lord’s Watch.

## **I. Rejoice/Adoration**

[Use an appropriate scripture: e.g. Psalm 100, Ephesians 1:15-23]

## **II. Repentance/Confession**

[Psalm 139:23-24, Isaiah 59:1-2]

## **III. Revival in the Church**

[e.g. Psalm 85:6-9]

## **IV. Reconciliation**

[e.g. II Corinthians 5:16-21]

Pray for unity between churches, and between Christians at work, in neighborhoods, schools, families, etc.

## **V. Reformation in Society**

Pray for the infusion of God’s righteousness and justice to address the issues of crime, drugs, immorality, poverty, materialism, loss of sanctity of life, etc.

## **VI. Reaching the Lost**

Pray for an awakening among those without Christ, including all ages, and all ethnic groups. Pray for a desire to seek Him who is “the way, the truth, and the life.” [John 14:6]

## **VII. Reflect**

[Psalm 111:2] Think of the mighty works of God and of His promises to you, our congregation, the churches of South King County, and to our society. Let’s all freshly yield ourselves to seek God’s kingdom and His righteousness.

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
