Wednesday, Aug.10 – **Isaiah 42:1-9** [This Servant passage, as the others in Isaiah, finds fulfillment in Messiah, Jesus Christ. Of particular note, vv.6-7, is that Messiah’s mission will include bringing light (salvation) to the Gentiles – meaning all non-Jewish peoples.]

Thursday, Aug.11 – **Acts 1:1-11** [Before His ascension back to the Father, Jesus told His followers to wait in Jerusalem for the empowerment of the Holy Spirit to enable them to be His witnesses (v.8). It is very clear in this verse that Jesus has missions in mind because He commands us to share the good news “to the ends of the earth.”.]

Friday, Aug.12 – **Jonah 4** [The most well-known part of the short book of Jonah is his being swallowed by a big fish. But the most significant lesson of the book is God’s mission heart for those lost and separated from Him. This includes even those guilty of the greatest wickedness, like the Ninevites. When they respond to the call to repent and be reconciled to God, He is pleased.]

Saturday, Aug.13 – **Revelation 5** [In this amazing picture of the glory of heaven it is significant that those who have put faith in Christ crucified (the Lamb) come from all the different tribes and peoples, etc., on earth.
