**Text: *Genesis 12:1-3;*
*Luke 22:14-23***

SUMMARY OF “SERMON”: God made a covenant with Abram, a binding of mutual blessing. God is a covenant making God through which He reveals Himself to humanity and calls us to faith in Him. The new covenant in Jesus’ blood is the fulfillment of all God’s covenants. Through faith in Christ we are bound to God through all eternity.

RELATED BIBLE PASSAGES FOR THE COMING WEEK [The Bible readings this week give more background about our Covenant making God.]

Monday, Sept. 12 – **Genesis 9:1-17** [This was the first covenant God made and while Noah and his immediate family are the specific focus we can see in v.17 that God also has in mind all life on earth. The sign of the rainbow is a reminder to those who know God our Creator that He is faithful to His word.]

Tuesday, Sept. 13 – **Acts 3:11-26** [Peter preached to the crowds after the healing of the lame man in Jesus’ name. In explaining the gospel note in vv.25-26 how Peter sees that Jesus Christ fulfills the covenant that God made with Abram.]

Wednesday, Sept. 14 – **Jeremiah 31:31-34** [The prophets saw that God’s covenant of grace would find a deeper expression that would transform His people from within. This, of course, was prophetically looking forward to the coming of Messiah and the Holy Spirit.]

Thursday, Sept. 15 – **Hebrews 9:11-28** [This passage poignantly reveals how Jesus fulfilled the Old Testament (Covenant) and brought the new covenant through His all sufficient sacrifice on the cross. Because of the perfection of His sacrifice there need be no other covenant with God.]

Friday, Sept. 16 – **Psalms 111** [This short but rich psalm is one of many places in the Bible that speaks of God’s faithfulness to His covenant (vv.5, 9). Our response is to worship, obey, and delight in our covenant making God.]

Saturday, Sept. 17 – **II Corinthians 3:4-18** [Paul explains how the old covenant has been fulfilled by the coming of Jesus Christ who fulfills all of the OT. The Holy Spirit witnesses to the glory of the new covenant in Christ by transforming our hearts.]



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
